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We invite you to submit your paper to the 6th Edition of the **Artificial Economics Symposium** that will be held in Treviso (Italy) on September 9-10, 2010.

AIMS AND SCOPE

Artificial Economics 2010 is the 6th edition of a Conference Series started in 2005. Previous meetings took place in Lille (2005), Aalborg (2006), Palermo (2007), Innsbruck (2008) and Valladolid (2009).

The main aim of the Symposium is to facilitate the meeting of people working on different topics in different fields (mainly Economics, Finance and Computer Science) in order to encourage a structured multi-disciplinary approach to social sciences. Presentations and keynote sessions center around multi-agent modelling, from the viewpoint of both applications and computer-based tools. The event is also open to methodological surveys.

Topics include (but are not limited to):

- Agent-based Computational Economics
- Agent-based Computational Finance
- Automated Markets and Trading Agents
- Design and Engineering of Economic Systems
- Interactions, Emergence and Complexity
- Large-Scale Simulations
- Methodological Issues
- Network and Social Dynamics
- Organizations and Management Science

The event will last two days in order to favour formal and informal occasions for sharing ideas. With this aim, the final schedule of the Symposium will devote considerable time to discussion. The Programme will offer presentations of papers reviewed and selected by the Programme Committee as well as special sessions by invited keynote speakers.

SUBMISSION

Submission of short version of the paper	February 10th, 2010
Notification of acceptance	March 20th, 2010
Final Paper Due	May 1st, 2010

The short version of the paper (presenting background literature, original issues addressed, some preliminary results and conclusions) must be 5 pages long.

Final version of the paper must be 12 pages long.

Contributions must be submitted through the Conference WebSite.

As for the previous editions, conference proceedings will be published as a Springer volume of the series
